<i>Definitions & Context</i>	<p>The following will be strictly adhered by the school.</p> <p>With the restoration of class X Board examination with effect from the Academic Year 2017-18, the assessment structure and examination pattern for class VI-IX will be similar to that of class X.</p> <p>This new scheme will bring uniformity in the system of assessment and examination for classes IX & X in all the CBSE affiliated schools.</p> <p>To increase the confidence in the students to start preparing for class X Board examination when they join the upper primary stage in class VI, the CBSE has decided to implement the uniform system of assessment, examination pattern and issue of report cards for classes VI to VIII also on the similar pattern. While keeping in view the provisions of Right to Education Act, 2009, the scheme for classes VI-VIII has been designed on Term Assessment basis with gradual increase in the learning assessment as the students move forward. This would prepare the students to cover the whole syllabus of the academic year and face the challenge of class X Board examination, and would thus, ensure the ‘quality of education’.</p> <p><u>Scholastic Area:</u> The assessment structure and examination for classes VI to VIII has been prepared in view of the provisions of RTE-Act 2009 and comprises of two terms i.e. Term-1 and 2 as explained below:</p>

Co-Scholastic Activities: For the holistic development of the students the co-curricular activities and discipline area will be graded on five point grading scale (A– E).

(I) Promotion Policy Subject to the following: (As per CBSE Guidelines)

1. A student must secure **33%** marks out of 80 marks in each subject in the Annual Examination conducted by the school.

2. It is also mandatory for the student to secure **33%** marks out of overall 20 marks (Internal Assessment) in each subject.

3. Students must obtain a minimum of **75%** attendance to be eligible to appear in the Annual Examination.

(II) Promotion Policy Subject to the following: (AS per KHDA & MOE Guidelines)

Grade VI- VII, no detention until and unless the candidate/ward is not meeting the rules & promotion policy of KHDA (MOE).

a) Grade VI, VII & VIII – A student need to secure following percentage of marks to be eligible for promotion ,these subject include the norms and policy of MOE

- i. Arabic -50%
- ii. Islamic -50%
- iii. UAE –Social studies -40%

b) The other subject follows the following norms of eligibility as per MOE norms.

- i. One subject -20% marks need to be secured by the candidate (16/80)
- ii. Two subjects-25% marks need to be secured by the candidate.(20/80)
- iii. Three Subjects -30% marks need to be secured by the candidate (24/80)

c) As per the MOE criterion –No retest will be given other than the subject mentioned - Arabic, Islamic & UAE Social studies.

The student will be declared ‘Passed’, provided he/ she qualifies the norm of CBSE & KHDA .


4. A student who do not meet the criterion laid down by CBSE & KHDA(MOE) shall be treated to have failed the examination and shall not be promoted.

5. Any student found using unfair means during any Examination will be marked as ‘zero’ in that particular subject and will not be promoted to next grades. (Refer CBSE Examination By Law).

We hope that with the cooperation and support of the parents, we shall be able to make a success of this system which is a path breaking initiative taken by C.B.S.E& KHDA (MOE) towards the holistic development of the students in a conducive environment.
